## **Policy exclusions**

The West Yorkshire Integrated Care Board (WY ICB) will not support referrals made to non-NHS providers.

## Policy inclusion criteria

The ICB will support referrals being made to an NHS Specialist Allergy Centre when the condition has been thoroughly assessed and standard treatment given by a GP or Clinician has not improved the condition and that the condition is considered 'resistant' to conventional treatment.

Patients with problems with allergies should be referred initially to the specialist services most appropriate to their needs, e.g. people who have an emergency treatment for suspected anaphylaxis.

Summary of evidence / Rationale	NICE Anaphalaxis quality standard (QS119) states; People who have had emergency treatment for suspected anaphylaxis (a severe, life-threatening allergic reaction) are offered an appointment at a specialist allergy service. This is to find out the cause of the reaction and to get advice on what to do in the future.
